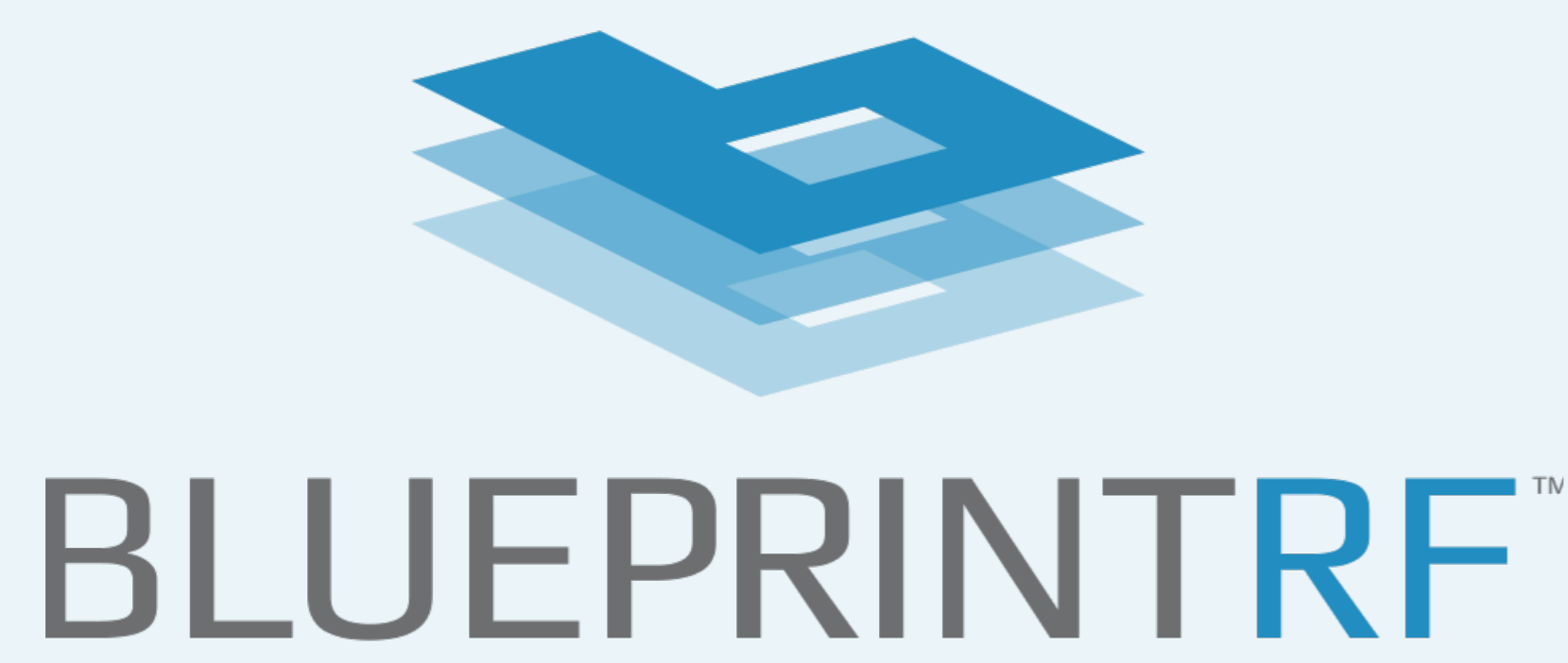
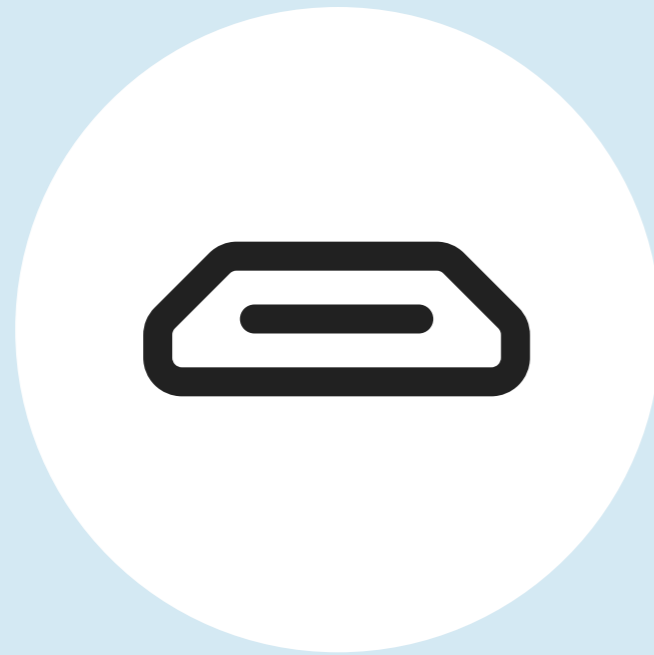


Connecting Roku to Hotel WiFi



Roku is a versatile streaming device that provides access to a wide range of content and streaming services. Here's how to connect Roku to your hotel network:



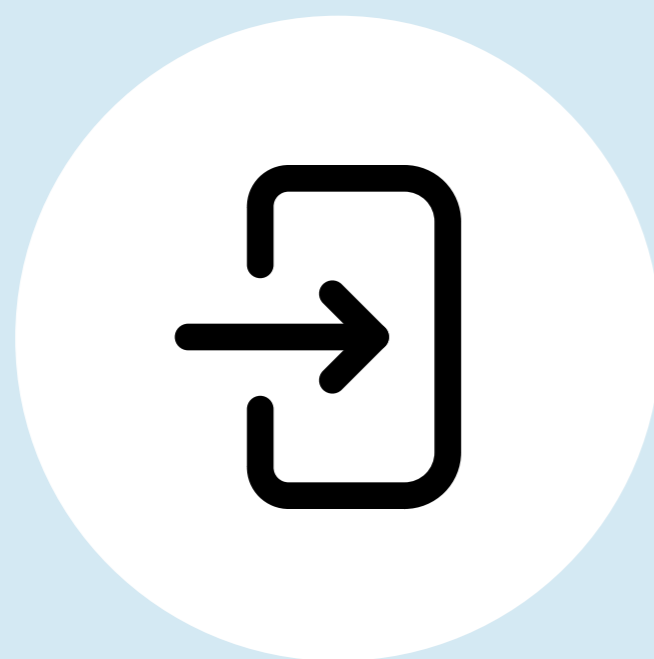
Find an available input port on the hotel TV

Check around the TV for access ports, labeled as HDMI 1, HDMI 2, or Video 1, Video 2, etc. if analog.



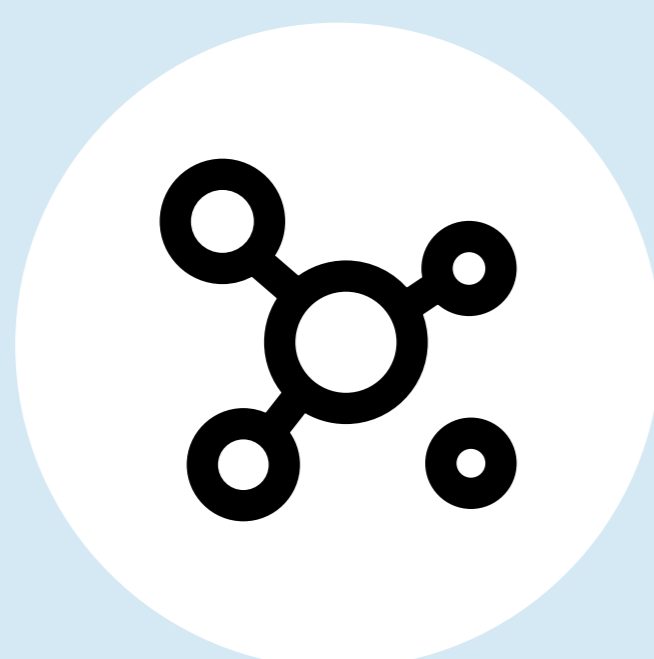
Locate a power source

Turn on the TV and switch to the input source into which the Roku has been plugged.

Using your Roku remote, navigate to Settings > Network > Set up connection. Choose the wireless option, and select your hotel's WiFi network.

If the hotel's WiFi network requires a login, you may need to use a workaround such as making a connection using your laptop. While uncommon, note that some hotels may have limitations on using personal WiFi networks or certain streaming devices like Roku.
